

TREKKING-TRAILING THE SUMATRAN ORANGUTAN 4 Days / 3 Nights


Head deep in to the jungle in search of Sumatra's wild orangutans. Spend three nights in Gunung Leuser National Park, trekking through dense forest to discover one of the world's most diverse ecosystems. Camp under star-filled skies, drift down languid rivers and spot exotic animals in their natural habitats.

3 Long Highlights:

- Encounter exotic wildlife
 - Join a guide for nature treks and, if lucky, catch a glimpse of orangutans, rabbits, hornbills and other jungle animals
- Sleep in the Sumatran jungle
 - Spend two nights in an eco-lodge and one night camping, surrounded by the sounds of jungle life
- Go tubing in Gunung Leuser Park
 - After a tough morning of trekking, drift down a tranquil river in a tube to enjoy the natural jungle surroundings

Day 1: Arrival Medan – From Buking Lawang to Feeding Platform – Bukit Lawang (-/-/D)

Arrive at Medan Kuala Namu International Airport on an early morning flight and meet with the local English-speaking guide and driver outside the arrivals area for a private transfer to Bukit Lawang.

Recommended flights: (Not included and quoted separately—Tariffs and schedule subject to change without prior notice)

- International: By Silk Air from Singapore with MI234 arriving Medan at 07:55 (daily)
- International: By Malaysia Airlines from Kuala Lumpur with MH840 arriving Medan at 06:15 (daily) or with MH860 arriving Medan at 08:50 (daily)
- Domestic: By Garuda Indonesia from Jakarta with GA180 arriving Medan at 08:00 (daily) or with GA142 arriving Medan at 08:55

The journey to Gunung Leuser National Park takes approximately two and a half from Medan. Stop en route for a lunch of local specialties (own account) before arriving at the park's outskirts in the town of Bukit Lawang around noon.

Gunung Leuser National Park is the last sanctuary of the legendary Sumatran orangutan.

Upon arrival, head on a short walking excursion along the river bank before crossing to the other side in a traditional canoe. From here, head further into the jungle for an up-close encounter with wild orangutans. While they feed, enjoy a special moment that will surely create a lasting lifelong memory. Afterwards, return to the hotel in Bukit Lawang.

Distance and journey time:

Transfer from Medan Airport to Bukit Lawang (108 km): 4 hours

Trekking distance: 1 hour 30 minutes

Difficulty: Easy



Day 2: Bukit Lawang – Jamur Batu Atas

(B/L/D)

In the morning, wake to a chorus of wildlife such as the gibbons and hornbills as they scramble around in search of fruit. The sheer array of sounds emanating from the jungle is both bewildering and magical.

Today's trek heads through the mountainous interior of the national park, beginning with a steep incline and rewarded with spectacular views. Occasional breaks are taken as required.

While venturing deeper into the jungle, try to be as quiet as possible to maximise the chances of glimpsing some of the endemic wildlife. With any luck, less commonly sighted species such as the Sumatran striped rabbit and a vast variety of birds



and butterflies may also be seen. Close encounters with local wildlife are a distinct possibility. Be mindful to never approach or touch an orangutan if the opportunity presents itself, and pay close attention to the instructions of the guide.

To conclude the day, discover how to set up camp in the Sumatran jungle after arriving at the first campsite. Assist with building a fire in order to cook a delicious jungle dinner. The local guide is well versed in 'camp cooking' and will be sure to share some of the secrets of how to dine well under the stars surrounded by jungle.

After a long and rewarding day of jungle exploration, tuck in for the evening and be lulled to sleep by the sounds of tropical wilderness.

<u>Distance and journey time:</u> Trekking distance: 6 hours Difficulty: Medium



Day 3: Jamur Batu Atas - Aras Pinang - Bukit Lawang

(B/L/D)

Rise early in the morning for a hearty breakfast and pack up camp before embarking on what is perhaps the most challenging day of the adventure. The terrain is very steep and the guide will assess everyone's abilities to ensure the safety of the group. Subject to the conditions, the routing may be adjusted to maximise the enjoyment and wellbeing of the group.

While hiking, the guide will keep an eye out for tell-tail signs of orangutans while trekking through the dense jungle. Aside from orangutans, a plethora of birds and smaller jungle animals may be visible through the mottled backdrop of the jungle.

Arrive at Aras Pinang at noon, and prepare tubes for a relaxing river journey back to Bukit Lawang. Lunch en route in the jungle.

Reminisce on the experiences of the last few days with a well-earned farewell BBQ dinner together with the local guide team.

Tubing: 1 hour
Difficulty: Medium

Day 4: Bukit Lawang - Medan - Departure

(B/-/-)

In the morning, check out of the lodge and return to Medan.

Flight schedule permitting, take a short city tour of Medan including a visit to Maimoon, the Sultan's Deli Palace built in 1888. In former times the Palace was considered as the center of the town before Medan developed into a proper city.

The tour continues to the Great Mosque. Built in 1906 by the first sultan, it's still considered as one the most beautiful mosques in Indonesia. Wrap the tour up with a visit to the beautiful Chinese Temple.

Afterwards, transfer to the airport for the onward flight.

Domestic: Garuda Indonesia late afternoon flight to Jakarta (no possible connection in Jakarta)

Remark on trekking:

During jungle trekking, porter will bring trekking & cooking equipment, logistic; porter does
not carry the participant personal gear it is advice to carry a lighter bag for all trekking
portion.



- Prepare a light backpack that you can carry during your trekking. Personal gear must be provided on your own: good trekking shoes, warm clothing, wind jacket, rain gear, hat/cap, sun's cream, personal medicine, and personal toiletries. should you some porterage this can be organize with additional fee (20kg max per porter, price to be advise on the spot)
- All camping material are provide by our local guide team (tent, nap for picnic, mattress, toilet paper), should you wish to bring your own camping material please inform your local guide upon briefing.
- We highly suggest to bring your own sleeping bag for more comfort

IMPORTANT NOTES:

- During the important **religious festival of Idul Fitri**, which falls in 2020 on 23rd & 24th May. intense travel across the country, especially in Java, has to be expected with the consequence of long traffic jams. Overland travel is not advised during the two weeks from 16th to 31st May 2020. Especially the ferry crossing between Java and Bali may be blocked. Service availability during that time may be limited, tour guides may be travelling home, and restaurants may be closed.
- During Nyepi Day, an important religious day in Bali, which falls in 2020 on March 25th, visitors and the public are not allowed to leave the premises of hotels from 6am to 6am the following day; all public activities will cease, hotels remain operational with limited staff; the airport will not operate any flights.
- We strongly recommend the purchase of travel insurance (covering emergency medical evacuation) prior to travel. Since we are not able to advice on any matters regarding vaccinations or other precautionary medical measures, we recommend the consultation of a travel- or tropical-medicine doctor.
- Prices are valid 30 days from date of offer. Past this date price and conditions may be readjusted. We reserve the right to adjust prices for exceptional circumstances which are not under our control with a notice period of 30 day prior to travel. Services which are already paid are exempt from this.
- Our prices are in United States Dollars (USD). Several of the services that we quote, are being paid in local currency the Indonesian Rupiah (IDR). In case of any significant change oft the official exchange rate of more than 5% to our disadvantage, we reserve the right to adjust prices. This would be done with a minimum notice period of 30 days.
- Our prices are based on a petrol price of 7.400 Indonesian Rupiah (IDR) / liter. Should the petrol price increase more than 10%, we reserve the right to adjust our prices with a minimum notice period of 30 days.



- Reservations during peak seasons (Christmas, New Year, High Season, and National Holidays)
 may be subject to supplementary charges, obligatory meals or minimum-stays. In certain
 cases, these may be announced late by supplier and hotels and may only be communicated
 upon the receipt of your confirmation of a booking.
- Please note that all the above services & tours have yet to be booked, they are proposed for
 your information only and we will not make any reservations before we receive your
 confirmation to do so. Availability is always subject to change until booking confirmation form
 our side.
- If any proposed service(s) is/are **not available at the moment of booking**, we will try to find other possibilities/options or other similar service(s) in order to avoid changes to the program.
- Room/Bedding-Configuration: Prices per person based on twin sharing relate either to accommodation in a Twin-, a Double- or a so called "Hollywood"-Double Bed configuration. The third bed for accommodation requested in Triple-rooms is often not a full-size single bed, but an extra-bed / roll-away bed / sofa-bed that can vary in size and standard from the regular bedding in the room.
- Rooms at hotels are available only from check-in time at 14:00 pm on arrival day till checkout time at 12:00 o'clock noon on departure date. A supplement may need to be added if
 early check-in or late check-out is desired.
- Road conditions in Indonesia are not always very good and this can cause slow driving times.
 As a general rule we calculate 30 km = 1 hour driving. This can be even less when traveling in very remote areas and jungles with 4WD jeeps. Also some islands are very populated which during public holidays and long weekends can cause traffic problems that can influence your journey time considerably.
- Note that visits to volcanoes are always subject to change and may be cancelled due to
 weather conditions or volcanic activity during time of travel; volcano trekking is not possible
 during rainy months from November to March, except for Bromo, Ijen and Batur volcanoes,
 where clearance only depends on the daily weather situation.
- We do not encourage activities that do actively involve wildlife, such as dolphin tours, etc.
 For activities where guests come in touch with wildlife, very high standards apply and are
 carefully monitored in our side. Note that upon wildlife observations, including bird watching,
 and also Orang Utan trekking trips in North Sumatra or Kalimantan there is never a guarantee
 to see certain bird or primates. In the months between July and September the probability to
 see Orang Utans in the wild or at feeding stations, may be slightly lower than during other
 months of the year.
- During the rainy season, especially during January and February boat transfers between Bali
 and Lombok or Gili Islands may be delayed or cancelled due to wave conditions in the Lombok
 Strait. We do strongly recommend using flights during that time! Occasionally cancellations



also occur during the dry season. At any time it is strongly recommended to add one interimnight between a speedboat transfer and onward travel. Any flights should not be scheduled on the same day after a speedboat transfer.

- Due to visibility, currents, higher waves and fast changing weather conditions, we refrain from booking **dive excursions** in Bali during the rainy season months from December to mid-March. All dive excursions take place at own risk and we reserve the right to let clients sign a waiver.
- Any travel itinerary is generally dependent on weather conditions, and its feasibility may be constrained due to exceptional environmental or social events or circumstances
- Among others, the following Indonesian airlines are currently banned by the European Commission from operating in European airspace for safety reasons: Citilink Indonesia, Lion (Mentari) Air, Transnusa Aviation Mandiri, Trigana Air Service, Air Asia Indonesia. Any booking of flights with so called "blacklisted" airlines is done only on request of the clients.
- Visa & Passport: Visitors with certain nationalities are eligible for a 30-day Visa-On-Arrival (VOA) or a Visitor-Pass at certain international entry points in Indonesia. Certain nationalities are eligible for a non-extendable 30-day visa-free stay, if entering and exiting at certain checkpoints, among them Jakarta, Medan, Denpasar, Surabaya (and Batam). This is only possible if both entry and exit are at these ports, why caution is required by visitors on which option to choose! Those nationalities which are not eligible for a VOA need to apply in advance for a visa with the embassy or consulate of the Republic of Indonesia nearest to their place of residence in their country. For further information on visa regulations please refer to the official websites of the Directorate General of Immigration: http://www.imigrasi.go.id/index.php/en/. Since those websites may not always be up-todate you may check with us on a case-by-case basis for the requirements of your booking. Note that the passport of persons travelling to Indonesia still needs to be valid for at least 6 month on the day of departure
